



History and Values of PDF

- Founded in 1981 as a public foundation
- Peace is not just the absence of war, it is the presence of justice
- Invest in the "seedlings of the movement"

PDF works to build the capacity of community-based organizations through grants, training, and other resources as partners in human rights and social justice movements.



What is Fiscal Sponsorship?


Fiscal sponsorship is a way to start new nonprofits and seed social movements.

A 501(c)3 Charitable Organization provides administrative services and oversight to a new idea or project.

Model A






Why be Fiscally Sponsored?

- Incubation for new projects and ideas
- Donors can receive tax deductions for their donations
- Economies of scale
- Access to infrastructure, expertise, and capacity-building
- Allows more focus on program and fundraising work

- Range in size from a few thousand dollars a year to more than a million
- 7.5% fiscal sponsorship fee + \$105 annual maintenance fee



Application Process

Conversation with PDF Staff

Discuss alignment of mission and programmatic needs

Board Approval

Sent with staff recommendation

Launch

Onboarding with PDF Staff Start fundraising Add PDF Seal to website

\$250 application fee

No deadlines

Questions and list of needed documents in FS Handbook

Online Application

Signed by PDF and FS Project Typically 3-5 weeks after receiving application
